The Screening Process.

s a private, non-profit agency, we feel it is very important to develop a relationship with each and every one of our adoptive families. Our team of professionals takes great time in getting to know each prospective family over a several-month period. By doing so, we can ensure that they are fully capable of giving your baby the life that he or she deserves.

All of the adoptive families at Adoptions With Love are prescreened and assessed through a series of background checks, home studies, and in-depth reviews of their personal records. The initial background checks include an FBI check, a sex offender registry search, a review of state criminal records, and a search of child abuse/neglect reports. Once a family is cleared in initial review, our adoption professionals conduct a series of more personal evaluations. We review their tax return forms in order to assess their financial stability. It is important that their income is sufficient to provide for your child for at least the next 18 years. We also require that each family member submit current medical reports and a detailed medical history, to ensure that all are in good health. Finally, we ask that each prospective family provide us with personal letters of reference. By doing so, we gain an outside perspective of the family and can hear how others believe the family will succeed as parents.

Following these initial requirements, **Adoptions With Love** then makes personal visits to the homes of each of prospective family. Through a "home study," we are able to see each family in their natural environment, and truly judge how prepared they are to bring a child into their lives. We make certain that their home is a safe and warm environment in which to raise a child.

The Screening Process, con't

In this process, a licensed agency social worker meets with the prospective couple, with the family as a whole, and with each family member one-on-one. These meetings tell us a great deal about the family and their reasons behind adopting. We are able to gain a sense of the stability of relationships within their home, the family's parenting philosophies, and their goals for a child once they do become parents. We also have the opportunity to experience their neighborhood firsthand. We can further assess its safety, its community, and the academic opportunities for a child in the area. If and when a family adopts a child, **Adoptions With Love** will continue these meetings after the baby is placed with them, to check in and make sure that everyone is doing well.

By requiring a full evaluation of each prospective family, and by working with you to understand exactly what type of home you want for your child, our team of professionals is fully committed to finding an adoptive family that best matches your adoption plan. If you make an adoption plan with us, you should feel comforted in knowing that your baby will be safe and secure. Whoever you choose as parents, you can have peace of mind knowing that your child will be sincerely loved and cherished by that very family for the rest of

eternity. That is our promise to you.

Things to Consider Before You Choose an Adoptive Family.

efore you choose an adoptive family, try to imagine your child years down the road. What type of life do you see for him or her? Does your child have siblings? A dog? Where does the adoptive family live—in the city, or in the country? You may already have a picture in mind of the perfect home and family for your child. By choosing an adoptive family, you have the chance to make this mental picture a reality. You, as an expectant parent, have the choice to select the family that will be best fitting to your child's life.

As you begin this process, make a list of characteristics that your ideal family will possess. This list will help you understand exactly what you value as important in a family, and what quality of life you feel is necessary for a child to have. Your wishes for your baby are our priority, and will always be respected. If you desire your baby to have two parents instead of one, if you desire a family that looks similar to your own, if you would like your child to be raised under a certain religious faith, we invite you to tell us more. In your search for a family, you may look for parents that already have children so your child will have a sibling. Questions to Ask Prospective Families.

efore deciding on a family, make sure you talk in great length about what exactly you expect from this adoption. As an expectant parent, ask yourself what you will require once your child is officially placed with an adoptive family. Will you schedule a certain number of meetings each year? Will you keep contact through Skype, email, or occasional phone conversations? Would you rather just receive updates through our letter and picture program? Would you like to remain completely anonymous? No matter what plan you decide to carry out, know that it will be the right one for you. Adoptions With Love will respect your wishes each step of the way.

As an expectant parent, you can design a personalized hospital plan. Ask yourself these important questions: When the day comes to deliver your baby, who do you want to be there beside you? Do you want the adoptive parents to come to the hospital and visit you immediately after? How much time do you want to see your baby after he or she is born?

While adoption laws vary across the country, each state requires that your final decision of adoption be made *after* the birth of your child. You can take as much time as you need with the baby in the hospital before this decision is made. Or, you can begin the adoption story immediately after birth. Some women wish that their child be placed with his or her new family right away, so that the adoptive family can fully embark on their journey of parenting.

As you begin to meet with the prospective family, these are important questions to keep in mind. Again, try to think of what matters most to you in a family. You may want to ask how long a couple has been married, or what makes their marriage so special. By seeing how much love they have for each other, you can gain great insight on how much love your child will receive. You can ask about how many children the adoptive parents plan on having, why they are adopting, and their plans for the future. You can also ask about their parenting philosophies, and what truly sets them apart from other parents out there. What do you want to know? What will help you know you are making the right choice?



Ongoing Contact Following Adoption.

doptive parents and birthparents can form a bond unlike any other because they all have one, particular thing in common: an unconditional love for their child. Because adoption has evolved so much over the past few decades, birthparents have the option of letting this bond grow beyond the placement of their child.
