Dear AWL Families,

I am pleased to report that 2022 ended with a rush of placements. It started as a slow year, with great concern for the future of private adoptions. In December, we created or expanded 8 families, 5 of which were with women that reside in MA. Our colleagues across the country also reported an increase in private infant adoptions.

Thus far in 2023, we have placed 19 babies into loving homes. We are hopeful that this trend will continue. We are adjusting to a new normal and learning to live with COVID. Most interviews and groups are now in person. We love seeing everyone's face!!

We continue to see a high level of homelessness and mental health problems plaguing the expectant parents with whom we work. As living expenses for everyone have risen, the cost of adoption has also increased. That coupled with the decrease in placements, the fees to adopt have also increased.

At AWL we are committed to finding the best home for each child. Often the best family cannot afford our fees, therefore, we try to award grants to deserving families. We also use donation funds to help with expectant/birth parents expenses. This is where we need your help. Your generous donations support us to help adoptive families and expectant/birth families. 
